Introduction

It is with great pleasure that we present this report on the accomplishments of the Central Coast Heart in its inaugural Premier League season.

From the idea that there should be a pathway from grass roots to elite netball for Central Coast athletes, this venture has blossomed into something that the region can be very proud of.

Our inaugural season was a steep learning curve. Strategies were developed and frameworks and systems were put in place to ensure the organisation ran efficiently and professionally.

Programs were implemented to promote the game of netball across the Central Coast including opening up Central Coast Heart training sessions to aspiring coaches in the region, supporting local netball events and running netball clinics for young players.

In addition, to further promote the game, a social media presence was established with our most successful Facebook post reaching 7,237 people.

The results we've achieved in our first year are a result of hard work and reflect the Central Coast Heart's values of care, commitment and honesty.

History of Central Coast Heart



The 2013 ANZ Junior Club of the Year was the Central Coast team – Pelicans.

The Central Coast has proven itself to be a successful netball region comprising three associations, fifty clubs, almost 6,000 players plus volunteer umpires, coaches, managers and supporters.

In 2011 Gosford Netball Association, Woy Woy Peninsula Netball Association and Wyong District Netball Association came together to form Central Coast Netball.

Central Coast Netball started out with one team in the 2011 State League competition expanding to four teams in 2015 and winning their first title in 2014.

A committee, comprising Dianne Selby, Amber Cross, Megan Sharpe and Donna Judge, was established in 2014 to prepare a bid for one of the eight licences in the inaugural Netball NSW Premier League competition.

Central Coast Netball was the only non-metropolitan franchise to successfully secure a licence in the new competition and the Central Coast Heart was born!

With the support of netballers across the region, the Central Coast Heart fielded two teams (Opens and Under 20s) in the inaugural 2016 Premier League season.

Gosford Netball Association

Gosford Netball Association was formed in 1961 as the Gosford Women's Basketball Association. Over 50 years later they are still based at Adcock Park in a 27-court complex with over 2,600 players.

In May 2016 Central Coast Heart athletes ran the barbecue as part of the Pink Sports Day raising funds for the Breast Cancer Network.



Woy Woy Peninsula Netball Association

Woy Woy Peninsula Netball Association was formed in 1980 and is based at Lemongrove Reserve.

In August 2016 Central Coast Heart Athletes ran a well-attended clinic for 9-10 year olds at Woy Woy.



Wyong District Netball Association

Based at Baker Park, Wyong District Netball Association was formed in 1961 and now boasts more than 2,500 players during their Saturday winter netball competition.



Our Netball Pathway

An objective of Central Coast Heart is to establish pathways to the elite level for local athletes, umpires, support staff and officials.

Central Coast Heart provides a mechanism to foster local talent (without losing this talent to Sydney) which, in turn, strengthens grass roots netball as Premier League athletes, coaches, managers and umpires do not have to leave the Central Coast and can stay with their local clubs to mentor others.

Our High Performance Program began with athlete induction in October 2015. Among other things, induction included pre-screening of athletes and a briefing on the off-season strength and conditioning program. Athletes completed a 12-week home strength and conditioning program between October and December, then came together in early January at the first ever Central Coast Heart Training Camp. Camp included a range of testing protocols, skills sessions, team building activities, and several educational seminars (nutrition, recovery, and injury management and prevention).

Regular skills training sessions began in mid-January with 1-2 sessions held every week (30+ sessions in total) throughout the course of the season. These sessions included numerous specialist presentations by Alison Broadbent and Marion Van Munster. Regular strength and conditioning sessions also began in mid-January with 30+ sessions completed at a variety of indoor and outdoor locations across the entire season. In addition to the on-court strength and conditioning sessions, athletes were given supplementary programs to complete themselves at home and in the gym. Re-testing of athletes was performed in April and in July. Athlete load management and wellbeing was consistently monitored throughout the season.

Results

In our inaugural season we achieved our goals of fielding competitive teams and setting the foundation for a strong team culture from which we could build in future years.

The Under 20s finished the season in 6th place with five wins, one draw and eight losses – with many of those losses being by very small margins.

The Opens finished the season with six wins, one draw and seven losses, narrowly missing the semi-finals on a goal countback.
